



Morice Town Primary Academy Remote Learning Policy

Overview

This remote learning policy provides guidance for staff, pupils and parents when remote education is required. It sets out the systems and technology used by Morice Town Primary Academy to ensure learning remains consistent and aligned to curriculum expectations.

SECTION 1: When a pupil is unable to attend school.

Should a child be unable to attend school, the school will provide remote education. The timetable of work will be available on their year group page on our school website. This will provide expectations for each year group on the work that is expected to be completed.

Mathematics

White Rose Maths online videos with WRM worksheets via Teams. Children will have access to WTM videos – these videos will teach small steps and then provide examples of work. They will then have a worksheet to complete that links with the video.

Reading

Children complete learning through Oxford Owl and Ruth Miskin portal. On Oxford Owl there will be reading books that are at an appropriate level. These will have comprehension questions linked to them for children to complete. Children who are on our RWI Phonics program, will be able to access online teaching videos for the speed sound sessions.

Writing

Children work through Oak Academy lessons linked to curriculum content. Each lesson will have a clear lesson objective and will be linked to the national curriculum objectives for their age group.

Foundation subjects

Children complete projects linked to learning taking place in school. This will be linked to

History/Geography, Science and Art.

SECTION 2: In the event of a school closure

On the first day of closure, teachers will carry out a Microsoft Teams meeting to explain arrangements for remote learning.

Lessons will be provided through Teams using White Rose Maths and Ruth Miskin RWI portal as explained above.

Returning to school

Children will be supported through a smooth transition back into school, with a focus on wellbeing, reviewing learning completed at home and returning to the full curriculum.

Teachers

Teachers will be available between 9.00am and 3.00pm and will support remote learning through approved platforms.

Teaching assistants

Teaching assistants will support pupils remotely, attend training and report safeguarding concerns where necessary.

Senior leadership team

The leadership team will coordinate and monitor remote learning arrangements.

Data protection

Staff must protect personal data and ensure devices remain secure.

Safeguarding

Parents, carers and staff should remain vigilant regarding online safety and follow school safeguarding procedures.
